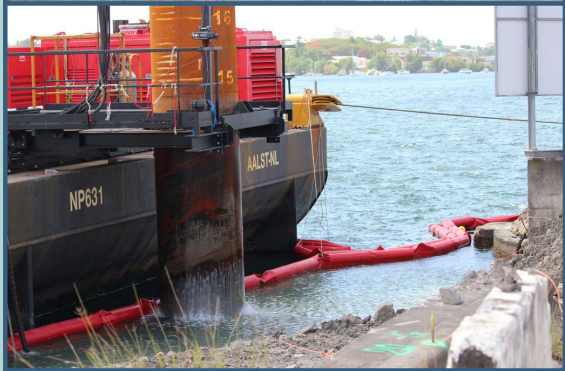

Integration of climate risks into the Master Plan



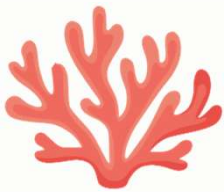

Restoring mangroves, seagrass beds, coral reefs



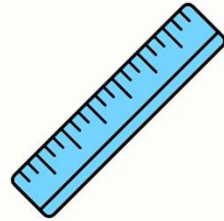

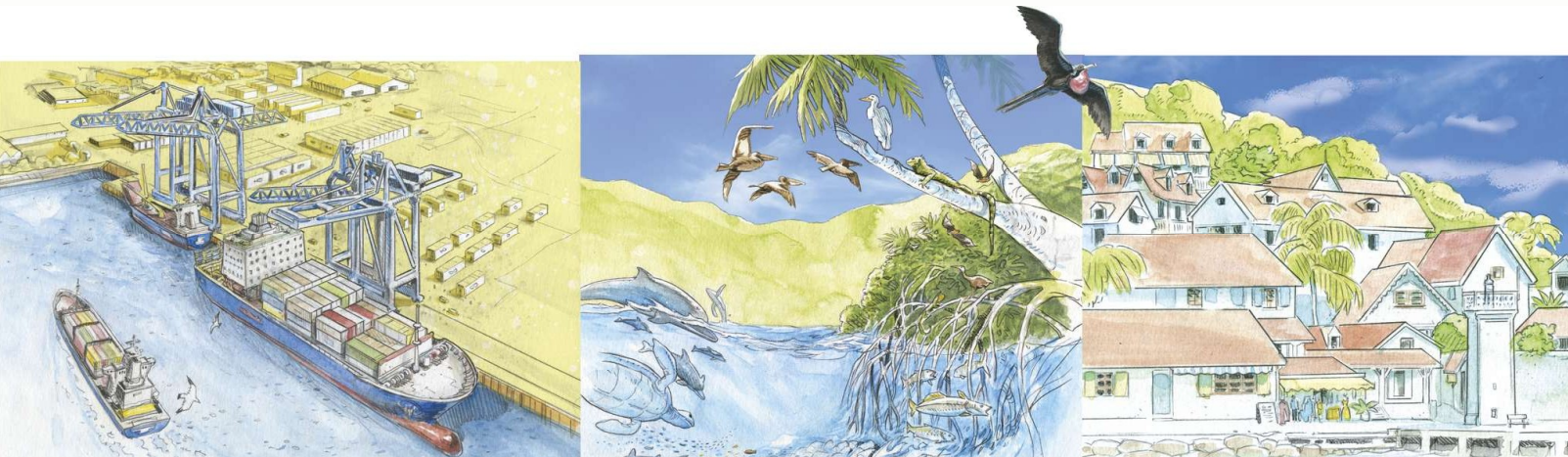

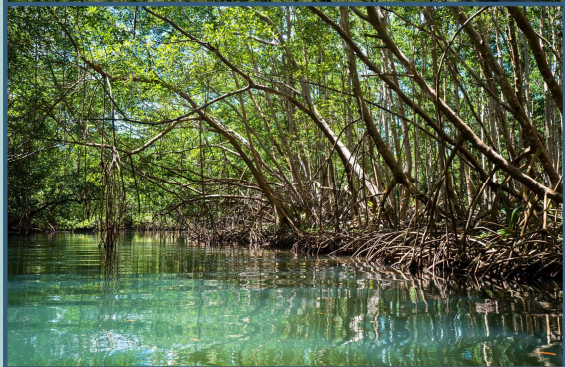
